My name is Steelee Morgan and I am the current Eminent Commander of the Kappa Pi Chapter. This October, the Kappa Pi Chapter will be coming up on

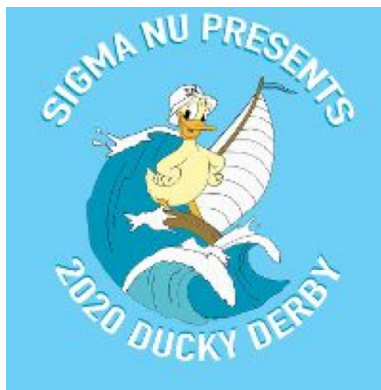
its 35th year at Cal Poly. The chapter currently sits at 99 active members with the recent addition of 25 in the Gamma Psi pledge class. Over the past year, the brothers of the Kappa Pi Chapter have continued the Sigma Nu way of striving for excellence in all areas of life including academics, athletics, philanthropy, personal development, ethics, and leadership. The chapter finished the academic school year of 2019 with the highest GPA of any organization involved in IFC at Cal Poly. Our soccer team won the Division 1 IFC Championship with a very young group of students that hopefully can keep the trend going for years to come. Additionally, our Division 1 IFC basketball and roller hockey teams finished in 2nd place and are hoping to win a title of their own this year. In our annual Ducky Derby philanthropy event, we managed to raise \$5,578 for Jack's Helping for children with cancer or special needs last year. This February, our goal is to raise \$10,000 for Jack's Helping Hand in our fundraising campaign. This past November, we launched a brand-new philanthropy event called Sigma Suds where we held a car wash at our chapter house in an effort to raise money for the End Kids Cancer organization. In total we raised \$650 and hope to raise over \$1,000 next year.

As some of you may know, our chapter went through a membership review last year and lost nearly half of our members due to a year long sober probation suspension. With a new executive board our organization chose to grow from this opportunity, focusing more on philanthropic activities as well as searching for more opportunities for the chapter to get more involved with the school. So far we have made great progress, but we continue in the pursuit of excellence. I am excited for the things that are to come from our chapter!

2020 DUCK DERBY

This year, Sigma Nu's Ducky Derby philanthropy event once again helped out Jack's Helping Hand, a local SLO organization that helps kids with cancer or special needs pay for their treatment. The boys did an outstanding job fundraising and we raised over \$16,000 for Jack's Helping Hand. The chapter raised more money through this philanthropy than any other fraternity or sorority at Cal Poly has so far this year. Additionally, our 2020 Ducky Derby ranked in the top 5 in terms of money raised compared to other Sigma Nu philanthropies across the country. We had a goal of raising \$10,000 and are extremely proud of our boys for blowing that goal out of the water. Hopefully we can use this as a precedent and make next year's Ducky Derby just as successful!
