# PRESIDENT'S YEAR IN REVIEW

Allow me to introduce myself as the new Eminent Commander of Kappa Pi. I am a third year Business Administration major concentrating in Finance and minoring in Statistics. I am a brother in the Gamma Phi pledge class and pledged during the fall of my freshman year. My older cousin, Kevin Gallagher K $\Pi$  582 brought me out to a Sigma Nu event when I was a senior in high school touring the university. I had a great experience meeting the guys. When I came to Poly, I knew that Sigma Nu was where I wanted to be. Since being in the fraternity, I have served on various committees and was Ducky Derby Chair in 2020. Ducky Derby gave me firsthand leadership experience in a major role and I led the brothers in raising over \$16,000 for Jack's Helping Hand, a new record for Kappa Pi.

The new executive board took over in January and the past quarter has had a lot of positives for the chapter. We initiated the Delta Alpha and Delta Beta classes, bringing in 27 new actives to the fraternity. The chapter now stands at 111 men strong. In terms of service and philanthropy in the San Luis Obispo community, we raised over \$2,500 for Woods Humane Society in our winter philanthropy. We look forward to putting on Ducky Derby over Memorial Day Weekend.

Although Covid-19 has put a damper on brotherhood and social events, there has been an improved focus on our candidate and rush processes. Despite both processes being altered due to the pandemic, we have been able to instill the values of Love, Truth, and Honor into the new initiates. I am excited to see what they will bring to the chapter.

Once we are through with spring quarter, there is a lot to look forward to in the fall. Although we do not yet know the details, the University has implied that next year will look very close to normal. It is our hope that we can transition back to full chapter operations in the fall and I am very excited to oversee the adjustment. I am hopeful about the future of the chapter and can't wait to see where this next year takes us.

Dimitri Kapetan is a second year agriculture business major and the Recorder for the chapter. Dmitri loves Sigma Nu mainly because of all of the different


gentlemen. Each person in the chapter is unique yet somehow all come together and work in unison.
